

# Youth with Refugee Experience Share Integration Stories through PhotoVoice

**TITLE OF RESEARCH:** **Flash Forward PhotoVoice**

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**SUMMARY:** Sixteen Syrian refugee youth aged 16-21 participated in photography classes, mentorship opportunities, and workshops in communication, creative expression, and presentation skills. Participants used photography to document their integration experiences in Canada, culminating in an online exhibit


## Recommendations:
